School Exchange Immersion Programmes

Enhancing the skills, knowledge and values to succeed in today's interconnected world.

GSE facilitates visits from global schools to UK primary and secondary schools throughout the academic year. Such visits create a real buzz of excitement within a school; students discover more about other cultures, practise their language skills, teamwork and communication skills, and learn about being a welcoming host.

Following a Welcome Assembly, visiting pupils and their accompanying teachers are fully integrated into school life for between 1 and 3 weeks, and are allocated a 'buddy' pupil at your school to shadow throughout each school day. They follow the timetable of their buddy, join their classes, and are immersed in school life. At the end of a memorable week, a Closing Assembly is held to reflect on the week, say goodbye to your visitors, and present certificates to all pupils and their buddies.

A GSE In-School Coordinator is present throughout to support the visiting pupils, assist teachers and ensure the smooth running of the programme.

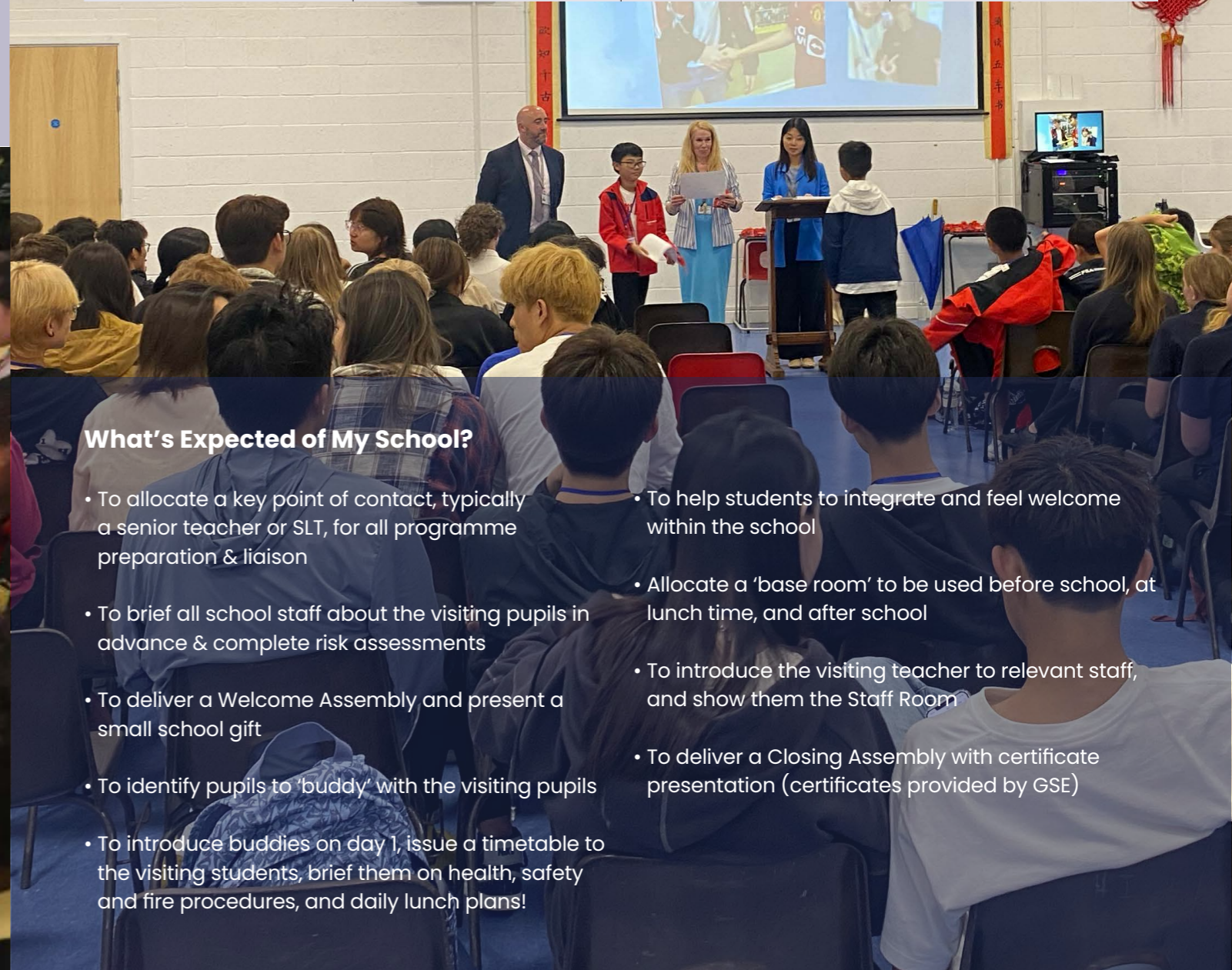

What's Expected of My School?

- To allocate a key point of contact, typically a senior teacher or SLT, for all programme preparation & liaison
- To brief all school staff about the visiting pupils in advance & complete risk assessments
- To deliver a Welcome Assembly and present a small school gift
- To identify pupils to 'buddy' with the visiting pupils
- To introduce buddies on day 1, issue a timetable to the visiting students, brief them on health, safety and fire procedures, and daily lunch plans!
- To help students to integrate and feel welcome within the school
- Allocate a 'base room' to be used before school, at lunch time, and after school
- To introduce the visiting teacher to relevant staff, and show them the Staff Room
- To deliver a Closing Assembly with certificate presentation (certificates provided by GSE)

GSE In-School Support

With over 10 years of experience, GSE facilitate & manage all programme activities.

Pre-Arrival

Before the group arrives, we meet with you and other key staff to prepare you for the programme, provide visiting student information, and issue resources to help your school prepare for cultural differences, etiquette, and practical information for the visit.

Where helpful, templates for the Welcome Ceremony, Closing Ceremony and various lesson plans are issued. A range of planning, safety, and lesson resources are available within our Exchange Toolkit.

If the visiting teachers and students stay with local host families, GSE manages all the safeguarding requirements, including DBS checks, references and home visits.

During the Visit

A GSE In-School Coordinator is present throughout to support the visiting pupils and ensure the smooth running of the programme.

Our Coordinator's role is to oversee the visiting group, provide support where needed, and liaise with UK teaching staff to ensure that the timetable runs smoothly.

They'll register and welcome the visiting students at the beginning of the day, supervise throughout and answer questions where needed, be present to remind the visiting teachers of school policies, run after school activities, and ensure safe departure at the end of the day.

Sister-School Partnerships

A sister school partnership is a meaningful and reciprocal long-term partnership between two schools.

These partnerships are a great way for schools to deepen their global learning and engagement, expose their students to different countries and cultures and build the global citizenship, intercultural capabilities and critical thinking of their students, teachers and communities.

GSE works closely with each school to develop clear objectives and outcomes for their Sister-School partnership, and carefully match schools which share mutual goals.

Virtual International Collaboration

Recent years have witnessed increased remote working, online delivery and digital collaboration. Virtual collaborative projects build valuable skills in remote team work, and nurture knowledge exchange across borders.

In some circumstances, online exchange takes place prior to an in-person school exchange visit- however some schools cooperate fully online.

GSE assists schools to build a virtual exchange which fits your schedule and learning priorities, and manage it to your timeframes and goals. Collaborative projects may last anywhere from one day, to a full academic year.

Each virtual programme is facilitated by a GSE Coordinator, who ensures the smooth delivery of the schedule and that students enjoy the activities.

Example Schedule: 1 Day China- UK Virtual Primary School Exchange

08:00- 08:30 GMT	Welcome ceremony Students and Teachers introduce their school & city
08:30- 08:45	Morning exercise: Chinese students introduce their morning exercises, and UK students complete the exercises
08:45- 09:15	Language Exchange & Song Learning
09:15- 09:30	Virtual school tour from both parties
09:30- 10:30	Calligraphy Workshop
10:45- 11:45	Chinese Lantern Making Workshop
12:00	Lunch time/ snack time: both schools sample 'local' foods and learn how to use chopsticks



Facilitated Online Arts Courses

Delivered by expert practitioners in their respective subjects, these 6-8 week live online courses focus on areas such as global theatre, music, world cinema and film-making.

Pupils collaborate in small groups with pupils worldwide, and produce a creative output, building vital skills in teamwork, remote communication and project management.

An annual China-UK Education Leadership Forum is held in conjunction with government departments and School Leaders. Previous locations include Shenzhen, China’s Silicon Valley, and Fuzhou, a historical port city.

Following the conference, you will learn more about the city’s education system and local industry via school campus tours, networking events, sightseeing tours and company visits.

Tailored Leadership Delegations – China / India

For SLT who prefer a more flexible approach or wish to visit Sister-Schools in a particular location, a typical leadership delegation operates for 4-5 days, and the itinerary and location can be tailored to your goals.

Delegations typically blend meetings with local School Leaders and Education Officials, school visits and dinners, with sightseeing tours and cultural immersion.

Leadership Delegation visits currently operate in China and India.

Celebrating Chinese New Year 2024
